Statistics

- I in 45 children was homeless
- 40% were 5 years or younger
- Since 1967, poverty rate for young families went from 14.1% to 37.3%
- Poverty for children linked to fewer years of schooling, working fewer hours, lower wages, and poor health





Bright Horizons Foundation

- Serve children and families experiencing the trauma of poverty through the Bright Space program
- Impact of poverty may include homelessness, and experiencing or witnessing violence
- Mitigating factors relationship building with children and parents



Toxic Stress

- Stress can be:
 - Positive
 - Tolerable
 - Toxic
- High levels of toxic stress can affect the brain
- The parent may be a victim of trauma as well



Trauma-informed Teaching and Caregiving

- Listen to children and parents
- Identify and be sensitive to triggers
- Provide a safe and secure place
- Share power
- Take a holistic approach
- Focus on success
