- Serve as a *liaison* with the city, district and state.



Baseline Model, ASK Mathematics and Language Arts Grades 4-8




Key: orange & yellow - charter, blue - NPS





#### Distribution of Enrollment in Math, 2011-13 Distribution of Enrollment in Reading, 2011-13






### Newark Charter Sector Growth



# Universal Enrollment SY 14/15



- Policy Design Committee:
   KIPP, Northstar, Marion P.
   Thomas, University Heights,
   NPS Office of enrollment
   informed the MOU
- 14/20 Charter schools or 85% of the charter seats participated in Universal Enrollment
- The 3/18 NCSF Compact signing schools did not participate in Universal Enrollment



# Universal Enrollment Year 2 Update

**94%** of students in the final grade at their school applied in Round 1 or Round 2

**76%** of students who applied in Round 1 were matched one of their top three choices

10% of students applied to change schools

42%

of applicants listed a charter school as their first choice
